What and Why

What

- Protect human health and the environment by making sure pesticides are used in a safe and legal manner.

Why

- Everyone uses pesticides.
- Everyone needs pesticides.
- Everyone is impacted by pesticides.



Registration, Certification, and Licensing

- Register Pesticides
 - 16,000 products/year
 - Special Local Needs (SLN/24c registrations)
 - Emergency Exemptions (Section 18's)
- Certify Applicators
 - 24,000 (16,000 commercial , 7,000 private)
 - 18,000 exams/year
 - 1,800 seminar approvals
- License Businesses
 - 2,300 pesticide applicator business licenses
 - 260 restricted use pesticide dealer licenses

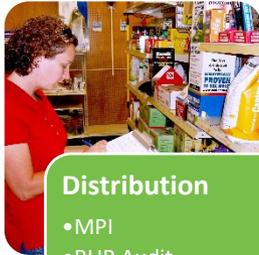

Drift Complaints

- Allegation that one party drifted pesticides onto another person or their property.

Drift = Chemical Trespass

- Typically receive about 50 drift complaints/year.
- Drift Complaint Season: May - October
- Locations: Anywhere in state but mostly the lower peninsula.

Drift Investigation Process

- Did drift occur and who is responsible?
- Document facts and collect evidence to support the facts.
- Evidence
 - Pictures
 - Statements
 - Records
 - Physical samples

Sample Collection

- Involves physically collecting plant foliage and/or swab sampling surfaces for lab analysis.
- Very time consuming
- Very Expensive
- Potentially unsafe for the investigator
- Not an exact science
 - What to sample? Where to sample? How much to sample?
 - Sometimes you can see where the drift occurred through visible damage, but often you can't.

Key Project Objective

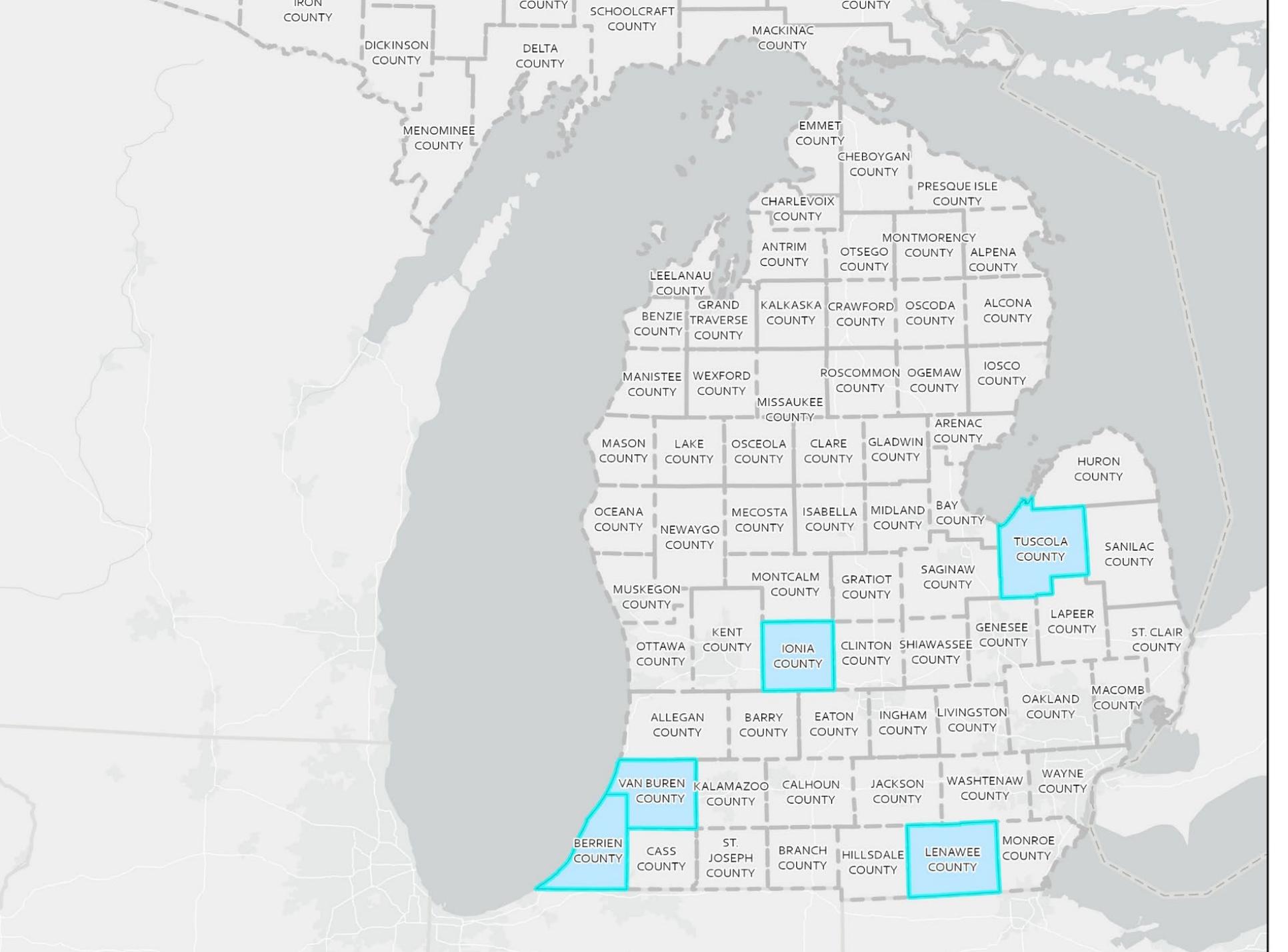
- Modernize MDARD's approach to pesticide drift investigations by equipping drones with remote sensing or similar technologies that can quickly, safely, and reliably help identify if chemical trespass has occurred.
- Remote Sensing: Help MDARD visually identify pesticide residues on plants and other surfaces OR visually identify symptoms of pesticide exposure on plants that cannot be seen by the naked eye.

Project Details

What: Partner will be deployed in tandem with pesticide inspectors during actual drift investigations to test and validate remote sensing capabilities.

When: During peak complaint season (May – August with July being the peak month)

Where: Southern tier of Michigan (see map)
